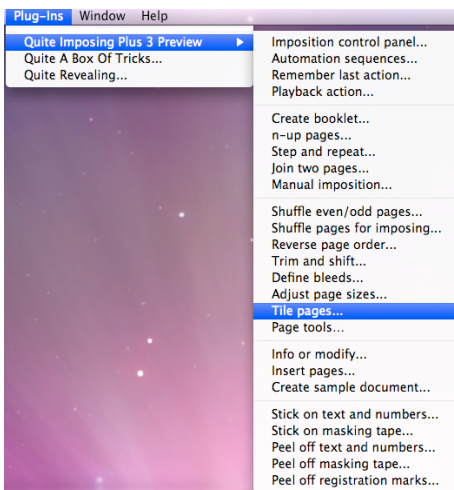
## TILE (SPLIT) PAGES...



- 1) Open up your PDF document

In this Example, We have opened up a 16 page PDF booklet and I would like Tile or Split it back into 32 single PDF pages.

*Note: I'm Using **NEW Features in Quite Imposing Plus 3.0** to do this Job. Earlier versions could Split pages but you had to duplicate the document and then Trim and Shift 1/2 left and right of that document. It could be done however, it took many more steps to do so.*



- 2) To access Quite Imposing Plus, simply Select >**Plug-ins** and then >**Quite Imposing Plus** from Acrobat's **Menu bar**. Alternately, selecting >**Plug-ins** from the **Menu bar** and then >**Quite Imposing Plus** >**Imposition Control Panel**.

- 3) Click or Select **Tile pages...** button  
*A dialog box will appear.*

*Note: In this dialog we will ask you a series of questions and give yo options that will work best for the particular job you are running.*

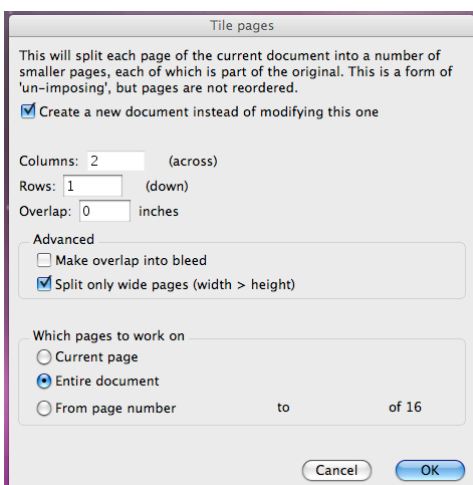
- 4) Check **Create a new document instead of modifying this one**.

Columns: **2** (across)  
Rows: **1** (down)  
Overlap: **0** inches

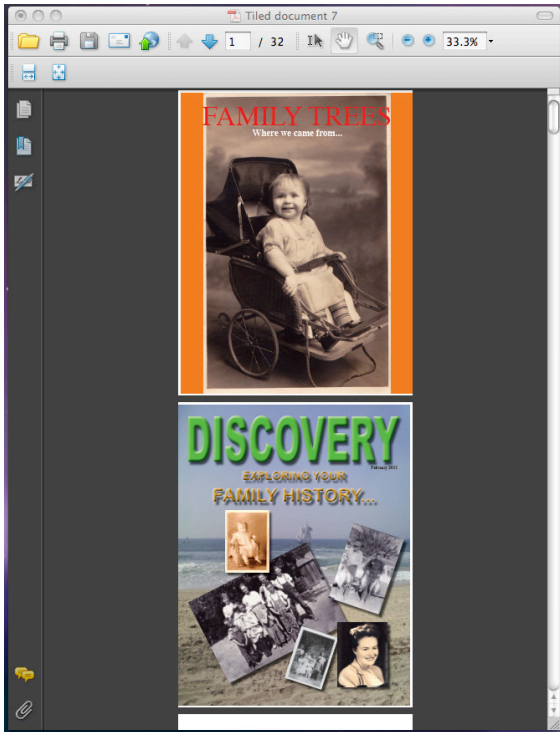
Advanced:  
Check **Split only wide pages** (width> height)

- **Entire document**

Click **OK** Button



## TILE (SPLIT) PAGES... Continued



*Note: You can also use this Feature to Split/tile sheets of tickets or labels that you may need to break up and then possibly number and do cut stacks.*

*Final Note: You can see all pages in your PDF have now been Split into single PDFs.*
